# ISWP Integration Subcommittee Wednesday, October 13, 2021 Meeting Minutes


The ISWP Integration Subcommittee met by conference call on Wednesday, October 13, 2021, from 10:00 a.m. to 10:50 a.m. U. S. Eastern Daylight-Saving Time/2:00 p.m. to 2:50 p.m. GMT. This provides the meeting minutes.

#### **Discussion:**

- 1. **Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes**: There were no changes to the September 1, 2021, meeting minutes.
- 2. **Feedback -- WHO Basic Reference Manual for Participants:** Amira reviewed the status of the WHO Basic Reference Manual review to date and proposed next steps.




One of the first recommendations from subject matter experts was to reorganize the content. Amira showed a draft of how the content could be reorganized and be presented in a uniform manner. A subgroup, comprised of Amira, Sara Munera Orozco and Krithika Kandavel, started with Steps 7 and 8.

The subject matter experts felt Step 7 should include more information on pressure injuries and transfers; the content for those currently is in other steps.

A subject matter expert also suggested focusing on whether a user could do a skill independently or with assistance and manually, or with mechanical assistance. This led to a subgroup discussion of ensuring the content is presented consistently throughout the manual and identifying additional content, as shown on the following page.



Amira then presented challenges associated with the project, as shown below:

## **Challenges**

- Time consuming to review the comments and to incorporate all the feedback - particularly with Covid challenges
- > 80% of the Step 7 content needs to be modified/expanded including adding new topics (eg: full wheelie).
- Pictures and videos need to be modified throughout the course.
- Terminology needs to be changed throughout the course (eg pressure injury vs pressure sore).
- The modifications needs to be added to three other languages (French, Spanish and Portuguese).
- Lack of resources to modify the Storyline Files (time estimation to implement the <u>reviewed</u> feedback is >200 hours).









The subgroup proposed a three-step process moving forward:



The webinars would be an important online forum to received feedback from the sector.

The subgroup also feels that they (Amira, Krithika, Sara) should meet in person in India to coordinate next steps.


Lee feels reorganizing the content will make it easier for the learner. Regarding moving forward, it would help to teach the course and use the material to determine how well the reorganization and additional content work. There is a lot to be learned by using it.

The group also should consider the development of the global Wheelchair Standards, which is using systematic reviews to inform the content.

Mary and Lee suggested inviting the Wheelchair Standards co-authors, Rachel Cowan and Kylie Shae, to the November 2021 Integration Subcommittee meeting to provide an overview of the Subcommittee's work (perhaps Rachel Cowan since she is based in the U.S.; Kylie is in Australia). **Mary Goldberg** to send the invitation.

3. Wheelchair Educators' Package: The internal and external reviews are completed; data is being analyzed, with a report to be ready in early November. The PAR Working Group will review the report during its November call. The next step is to determine pilot sites and begin recruitment; the Pilot Sites Working Group will meet in November.

- 4. **Academic Training Partners**: The 29<sup>th</sup> meeting was held on Monday, October 11. Krithika presented the Wheelchair Service Provider certification, including how to take advantage of discounts and how to recognize courses. Krithika will be meeting a partner from NHS, UK, about next steps. The next meeting will be in November, when representatives from the Western Australian government rehab center will discuss changes, they made to their rehab training program; date is to be determined.
- 5. **ISWP Central Update**: A no-cost extension was submitted to URC/USAID through September 30, 2022, to cover completion of the Wheelchair Educators' Package and the global Wheelchair Service Standards. ISWP received funding approval from UNOPS/USAID to support separate entity initiatives and to continue to support current ISWP activities through March 31, 2022. The ISWP Founding Board will be meeting soon to develop of a list of initiatives to be included in a future funding request, which will be prepared by the new entity. ISWP has received requests for training support and WSP Certification from several organizations, including the following:



ISO approved the caster durability standard in September 2021.

- 6. **Publications**: The paper "Wheelchair Service Provision Content in Professional Rehabilitation Organizations' Standards Documents and Contemporary Initiatives: A Rapid Review" was submitted to *Disability and Rehabilitation: Assistive Technology*.
- 7. **Conference Submissions**: Abstracts were accepted to OSS (April 5-7, 2022) and WFOT (August 28-31, 2022). These sessions could be opportunities to present the Subcommittee's recent work on revising the Basic reference manual.
- 8. <u>Wheelchair Skills Course</u>: The original date for the course was October 18, but with COVID restrictions, it was rescheduled and moved online. Registrations are still being accepted up to October 22 (<u>link</u>). Participants from Canada, U.S., Africa, and Australia have registered to date. <u>Lee Kirby</u> to provide information to include in the Hub newsletter.
